Suzanne is Adjunct Professor in the Faculty of Medicine's Occupational Health program at McGill University. She was the co-director of the department's distance education program for graduate level training in occupational health from 2000 until her retirement from her administrative roles in June of 2007. Her scientific publications focus on education in occupational health nursing in areas such as technology, remote learning and emerging trends and issues.

Prior to her graduate education, Suzanne gained valuable experience on the front line in occupational health nursing, providing her with a strong foundation of practical clinical experience in a wide variety of settings (e.g., audit of OHS services at a major government-financed mining operation). She worked with the T Eaton Co, Shell Canada, Partec-Lavalin and Celanese Canada among others. Her academic pursuits well suit her to playing a key role in project design, the development of quality research tools and the interpretation of results.

Among the awards she has received, Suzanne earned the Ontario Occupational Health Nurses Association's Lifetime Achievement Award in 2000.
